

## Class 5 - Summer Term 2026



Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the Summer Term. This term, we look forward to enjoying Forest School, cookery, singing at the Royal Albert Hall as well as the end of term events.

**Pencil cases- glue stick, pencil, pen, 30 cm ruler, scissors, pencil sharpener, coloured pencils, whiteboard pen and a rubber.**

**It is also helpful to have a highlighter.**

PE will take place on Mondays: children will need their PE kit in school to change into after lunchtime. Swimming kit needs to be in school on a Wednesday.

Forest School will take place on Thursday afternoons after Half Term. Children will need to come to school wearing suitable clothing (not school uniform) for the woodland: long trousers and long-sleeved tops. They are likely to get muddy so old clothes would be ideal. If the weather is wet, please can they bring wellingtons and waterproofs to school in a separate bag.

Cookery will take place all day on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> July. Children will need to bring an apron (top and bottom covering please) into school for their use. Parents will be invited into school in the afternoon to share the cooking with them. More information will be sent out nearer the time.

### **Literacy**

During the first half of the summer term, we will be looking at The Piano – a short animation which will lead to the children creating their own pieces of narrative based on the main character.

During the second half of term, we will be looking at non-chronological reports and the children will plan and write their own report about London (linking to our Geography topic).

We continue to encourage the children to read quality reading books as this impacts hugely on their writing ability.

Our guided reading text is The Boy at the Back of the Class.

### **Spelling and Grammar**

We will continue to remind all pupils about the importance of correct copying from the board and taking pride in the work they produce. Spellings will focus on Y5 required spelling patterns and on the Y5/6 statutory word list.

If the children complete their home learning before Wednesday, they are welcome to hand it in. Each piece of home learning should take approximately 35 minutes. If a child does not hand their homework in on time, they will complete it during Thursday breaktime. A warning will be given first.

Please encourage your child to take responsibility for completing home learning, checking it through for spelling and punctuation errors as well as handing it in on the correct day.

### Reading and Homework Diaries:

Reading is such a key activity for Year 5 children and so we are monitoring their reading quite closely. Children are being asked to record their reading directly into their homework diaries themselves. We are asking you to then sign to confirm they have read at least three times a week.

Please sign these at the end of each week, ready to check on Wednesday morning.

**Three ways to support your child:**

- Hear your child read and discuss their reading with them.
- Keep testing your child on their times tables. Tables need constant practising as they are easy to forget and tough to master/recall instantly.
- Check that they have all the correct equipment daily so they can be successful with their learning.

**Times Tables:** There will be a test each Friday on a specific times table. The order this term will be 2,4,8,3,6,12,7,9,5,10,11. Times Table Rock Stars is a fun and engaging way to learn times table facts and we encourage the children to practise little and often throughout the week.
