Dear Parents.

Welcome back to the new term.

Literacy: Our first topic is on writing suspense stories; later on in the term we will be looking at diary writing. The children will be having their practise SATS on the week beginning 23 January and are in the process of undergoing checks on how their spellings are progressing. They will continue to learn their curriculum words: please help your child understand that the words given are commonly misspelt words; and learning them just for the test does not necessarily mean that their knowledge sticks. It would be good to revise them regularly.

Maths: With the splitting of the class into two groups, as is often the tradition of Curzon at this time of year, children will hopefully benefit from smaller groups and a more focused pitch to their needs. All children will cover the same topics, and these will include fractions, decimals and percentages; algebra; and SATs-style reasoning questions.

Times Tables	12 x 12	All times tables must be known, calculated <i>at speed</i> , and need to include multiples, factors and the inverse (division facts). These are crucial to development in maths generally.		
Reading	Children should be reading alone (and occasionally to an adult) preferably <i>daily</i> , but with a minimum of 3 times a week.
