#### Home learning

Maths and Literacy homework is given to children on Wednesdays and due in the following Monday. Please sign homework diaries and add any comments you may have to the Maths and Literacy homework books. Your child should spend around 30 minutes on each activity.

We expect children to read at least three times a week to an adult and any comments to be noted in their Reading Record. Please sign their Reading Record at least once a week and ensure your child brings a book and their Reading Record to school every day. Try and make time spent reading together as relaxed and as enjoyable as possible and encourage your child to talk about their reading. Keep reading to your child too, finding time for a bedtime story is a lovely way to end the day and a chance for children to hear language and access books that they may find difficult to read themselves.

Times tables - please help your child to learn times tables up to 12x12 as we progress through the school year. Sound times tables knowledge is an important foundation for learning so many different aspects of mathematics, including division, fractions, percentages, algebra and of course multiplication itself. A times table grid and tips on how to learn tables will come home soon. We will also be practising mental maths skills, including times tables, in school regularly.

## Celebrating achievements

We enjoy hearing about children's achievements outside school. Please let us know of any extra-curricular achievements, for instance passing a music exam, attaining a well-earned badge in Cubs or playing particularly well in sport at the weekend.
