

Curzon Sports Premium expenditure Sept 2015-July 2016.

The government provided funding nationally to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport that schools offer. Money received by Curzon for the academic year was £8,640.

The rationale for spending this funding was to;

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that the school already offers
- make improvements that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Sports Funding Criteria	Cost	Impact
1. Hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers	£850	Teachers' skills and quality of PE lessons improved.
2. Provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively	£720	Swimming training enabled a 2 nd coach to work with less able pupils. KS1 training a new teacher to develop initial pupil PE skills. Crash mat to extend gymnastic skills: the Senior gym club gained Bronze position in a recent competition, performing well, utilising this training.
3. Introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport	£1500	Examples of new sports and activities introduced this year have been cheerleading and chess. Year 3 pupils enjoyed a wider range of sport than they experienced in KS1 eg hockey, tennis, tag rugby. New games successfully introduced into playground to reduce any potential behaviour incidents.
4. Support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs	£650	Clubs extended to include Taekwondo and ActiveGamerz. Evidence of good participation by some less active pupils, enjoyment and improvement of skills. No of pupils who attended a club risen to 90%
Sports Partnership joined to enable;	£2,000	Increased opportunities for success and celebration of both individual and school sporting success, increasing pupil engagement and enjoyment.
5. Run sport competitions	£1,380	Transport costs enabled more quality opportunities to be gained and all pupils able to access sports partnership opportunities.
6. Run sports activities with other schools	£3,000	Events for Curzon pupils to meet and play against pupils from other schools promoted inclusive practice and through competition, developed skills Increased self-esteem eg pupils beat personal best records in number of running relays in Cross Country, scoring goals in football matches against other schools. Sports festival entries were extended to include a swimming gala this year to give opportunity for pupils to utilise new swimming skills gained. Ensuring events are organised well and have secure health and safety checks in place
