Welcome back Class 2!

I hope you all had a lovely Christmas break and had some time to relax amongst the festivities! Firstly, I would like to say a huge thank you for all the generous and thoughtful gifts Mrs Atkinson, Mrs Rosello and I received at the end of last term.

This letter will give you some extra information about what we will be covering this term and any changes there are compared to last term. Remember if at any point you have any questions or anything you wish to discuss with me, please feel free to approach me on the playground at the end of the day or arrange a time to come and see me.

<u>Literacy</u>

This term the children will be learning about traditional stories, writing recounts of events and narrative diaries.

In order to become a successful writer, it is important that children are consistent with basic sentence punctuation (full stops and capital letters) as well as writing in a clear and neat cursive handwriting style. It would be most helpful if you could encourage your child to write at home (about anything that interests them) with a focus on these targets. I would be happy for children to bring in any quality writing they have done to show during Show & Tell.

<u>Phonics</u>

There have been some changes with groupings and teachers this term to make sure that every child is getting the right level of support. Please help us to support your child by continuing to ensure that they practise their spellings at least 3 times, write out their sentences and hear them read regularly at home; **once a day** is strongly recommended to help your child to make the most progress in their reading. If your child is stuck on a word, ask them to use their phonic skills to help blend the sounds together, where this is appropriate.

<u>Numeracy</u>

This term we will continue to develop the key skills that the children learnt last term. This will prepare the children in Year 2 for their SATs as well as allowing the Year 1 children to try a range of new challenges.

The areas we will cover this term include:

Addition and Subtraction (particular focus on quick recall of number facts) Multiplication (repeated addition) Simple division (sharing/repeated subtraction) Simple Fractions using ½ and ¼ Direction (anti/clockwise) Time (to 5 minute intervals) and Measuring (kg/g and cm/m) Interpret and draw graphs 3D shapes

It is important that your child can confidently use mental addition and subtraction to recite number bond facts to 20 (Year 1s) with quick responses to number fact questions (e.g. 'What do you add to 35 to make 100?') and their 2, 5, 10 & 3 times tables. These skills are fundamental to the depth of understanding that children in Key Stage One should develop. It would be extremely beneficial if your child can practise their number bonds and times tables regularly at home.

<u> P.E.</u>

Just a reminder that PE lessons this year will continue to take place on **Wednesday and Friday afternoons.** Please ensure that your child has their correct P.E. kit in school for these days. This term that includes a warm tracksuit for outside in the cold weather as well as shorts for inside.

<u>Homework</u>

A reminder that all children are given their **Maths homework** on Mathletics on a Monday. Children are expected to have completed this (normally 2 activities) by the following Monday. They will also bring new **spellings** home on a Monday and these need to be returned the following Monday with spellings practised ready for their test. Please ensure your child practises their spellings in their spelling book **3 times** interspersed throughout the seven days and writes their sentences so I am able to see their progression. **Bug books** to foster reading comprehension skills are given out on a Tuesday and to be returned 2 weeks later on the Monday (on a 2 weekly cycle).

<u>Parent help</u>

If you are able to spare any time to come in and hear the children read, I would greatly appreciate any offers as the children benefit significantly from reading aloud to an adult on a 1 to 1 basis. Please let me know if you are available, even if it's just for half an hour at the beginning (9-9.30am) or end of the day (2.30-3pm). Thank you to everyone that gave up their time last term. It is greatly appreciated.

<u>SATs</u>

If you have a child in **Year 2** and want to know more about the SATs tests and how best to support your child at home, please come to the Year 2 SATs meeting at **<u>3.05pm on</u> <u>Thursday 18th January</u>**. There will be a crèche available.
