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Curriculum at a glance - Autumn Term 2018

Literacy	Stories in imaginary worlds (Narnia), news reports and diaries. Spelling and grammar, guided reading.		
Maths	Number and place value; measurement (time, area, perimeter, length, weight, capacity); geometry (2d shapes, angles, symmetry, position); mental strategies and written methods for addition/ subtraction/ multiplication/ division; fractions and decimals; statistics/data handling; problem-solving.		
Science	States of Matter and Sound	RE	What is the Trinity?
ICT	General ICT skills & PowerPoint	PE	Netball

Home learning - Homework, homework diaries and reading records are due in every **Tuesday**. It is your child's responsibility to ensure they find out what the homework is if they miss the lesson when it is set.

SPELLINGS: Set Monday as handwriting practice. Tested the following Monday.	Practise at least 3 times a week, making sure you understand the meaning of the words. Spellings will be set to practise a spelling rule or to support an area of the curriculum. A few spellings from the Year 3 and 4 spelling list will also be included each week (see the list attached).
LITERACY: Set Wednesday, due in Tuesday, sign and add any comments to the homework diary.	30 minutes. Finished too soon? Check and improve – proof-read, add detail, illustrate, extend written work or read related articles or stories. Sometimes set through Reading Express.
MATHS: Set Wednesday, due in Tuesday, sign and add any comments to the homework diary.	30 minutes. This will sometimes be set through Mathletics. Alongside homework, please practise telling the time regularly, using both analogue clocks (with a face) and digital 12 and 24-hour formats.
READING: At LEAST three times a week, with an adult signing and noting comments in the Reading Record.	Reading Records should be in school every day and are checked on Tuesdays. Please keep listening to and reading with your child regularly. Try and make time spent reading together as relaxed and as enjoyable as possible and encourage your child to talk about their reading. Keep reading to your child too, finding time for a bedtime story is a lovely way to end the day and a chance for children to hear language and access books that they may find difficult to read themselves.
TIMES TABLES: Several times a week as required.	The national curriculum target is for all children to know their times tables up to 12x12 by the end of Year 4. It's a life skill and helps enormously with accessing other areas of maths. Please keep on practising! Times tables tests will be held in class weekly. A times table grid and tips on how to learn tables will be sent home.
