<p>Literacy (Writing)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Diary of a Stone Age child • Description of Stone Age setting • Instructions for washing a woolly mammoth <p>Key Y3 skills: using expanded noun phrases to describe characters and settings; adverbial phrases; paragraphs; using imperatives; using capital letters for all proper nouns and using ?; editing own punctuation and spellings.</p> <p>Key Texts: Michelle Paver Wolf Brother; How to Wash a Woolly mammoth; Stone Age Boy</p>	<p>Literacy (Reading)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Whole class reading • Catch up phonics groups <p>Key Y3 skills: reading age appropriate books with confidence and fluency, using phonics to decode unfamiliar words; pausing for simple punctuation; using context of sentence to infer meaning of new words, summarising, inferring, discussing choice of language</p> <p>Key Texts: Fiction: Boy with the Bronze Axe Non-fiction: Christmas Traditions, Divali e book Poetry: Where the poppies now grow</p>	<p>Maths- White Rose</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Addition and subtraction: adding 2 digit numbers crossing tens; subtracting 2 digit numbers • Multiplication and division: using arrays; sharing; grouping; dividing • 2,5,10, 3,4, 8 x tables 	<p>Science – Forces and magnets</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • compare how things move on different surfaces • notice that magnetic forces can act at a distance • identify some magnetic materials • poles • investigate friction • create own magnetic game <p>Key lower KS2 skills: suggesting how to make a fair test, using equipment accurately to make observations; explaining result.</p>
