Barn Owls – Summer Term 2025



Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you all had a lovely Easter holiday and managed to enjoy lots of family time together with your children enjoying the outdoors. We have enjoyed hearing about the children's activities over the school holidays. Thank you all for your kind messages and Easter treats.

Year 1 Phonics

The children in Year 1 will be working towards their phonics test this term so do practise little and often, just five minutes a day makes a huge difference, and their confidence will grow too. Year 1 children will have a home learning sheet with all the sounds and sentences we are writing during the sessions sent home with their spelling books each Tuesday. Please use the sheet to help your child become familiar with the sounds and practise writing the sentences.

The children will be completing small group guided reading sessions in school (10 minutes per session) with staff to develop decoding, blending, fluency and comprehension skills.

Please help us to support your child by continuing to ensure that they practise their spellings at least 3 times, write out sentences containing their spelling and the tricky words (words that do not always follow the normal spelling patterns) and hear them read regularly at home, **once a day** is strongly recommended to help your child to make the most progress. If your child is stuck on a word, ask them to use their phonic skills to help blend the sounds together.

We will continue our Little Wandle sessions daily with Reception and they will have their weekly learning sheet posted on Tapestry. If you would like to reactivate your Tapestry account so you can access the home learning little Wandle sheet, please contact the school office with the email you would like a link sent to. Please do support your child from home to develop their confidence with saying and reading the sounds. Magnetic letters are a great resource to build and sound out the words together or scrabble letters.

Reading books

We recently purchased some new books for Barn Owls and Snowy Owls because our stock had become very low due to books not being returned each week.

Could we kindly ask that any reading books are returned to school on Mondays where staff will log that they have been returned and new books handed out. Sadly, if books are not returned, we will not be able to issue new ones until they are. This is to avoid us having to re stock again at great cost to the school. Thank you for your support in this area.

Reading at home

It is important to read daily with your child. Do encourage them to sound out the words and try to read for themselves. This will really help to develop their confidence with reading in preparation for Year 1 and 2. Please sign the reading diary each week to let us know how this is going. Little and often is key. Children, who do this, make huge progress and do enjoy sharing their love of books with us. In line with our Little Wandle phonics scheme ,the children will bring home two reading books that link to the phonic phase they are currently being taught. These books can be decoded and sounded out. . Aim to read the same book 2 or 3 times until your child can fully decode and fluently read this themselves.

The children will also bring home one-story book you can read to them and enjoy together

Please return reading books on Mondays when we will mark reading records and send new book home on Tuesdays.

Literacy

We will enjoy reading lots of different fiction and non-fiction books this term. Books this term have a space theme which link to our history topic, so lots of cross curricular learning can be fulfilled.

PE

PE lessons will take place on **Wednesday** mornings and **Friday** afternoons. As the weather improves, we will aim to have PE outside so please do provide your child with outdoor shoes and jogging bottoms for a slightly cooler day. Please ensure that your child has their correct PE kit in school and that **everything** is labelled. The children will leave their kits at school and bring them home at half term. We continue to have items of PE kit unnamed and with 27 children getting changed, it can be tricky to ensure all items go in the correct

bag. We are working on this! Do encourage your children to get dressed/undressed themselves as this is a vital skill. It's also great for fine motor development 😊

Home learning

This term all homework will be set for all children in Barn

This includes, spelling, reading books, Mathletics and literacy sent via either email or on paper in bookbags. Reading eggs will no longer be used in school. Please continue to practise spelling 3 x weekly and write out spelling sentences to include your spelling words.

Please return Year 1 spelling books every **Monday morning** for homework to be marked and for the children to complete their weekly spelling test. Spellings will be returned home on Tuesdays once they have been marked.

Children in **Reception** will have a few spellings to learn after May half term and in preparation for Year 1.

Labelling

Please ensure that all belongings (even sunhats and socks!) are clearly labelled with your child's name. This both helps your child to recognise their name and locate their own belongings, but also enables misplaced items to be easily identified and returned! It is of huge benefit to us all when items are labelled and saves huge amounts of time when staff have to look for them rather than be teaching your children. Misplaced items are placed in lost property in the cloakroom. Please do ask if you are not sure where this is located.

Pencil cases

Children will no longer require pencil cases in school this term. Before Covid children in KS1 used to share whole class resources in baskets on their tables. This maximises table space and helps the children to remain focused on learning rather than who may be looking or wanting items in their pencil cases. We have a whole class set of writing pencils, whiteboard pens, colouring pencils, felt pens and crayons. We would be very grateful indeed for generous donations of writing pencils, glue sticks and colouring pencils if you do see any on offer as our stocks do go down quite quickly! These will be shared within the class, and we do appreciate your understanding with us returning to how we originally used whole class resources pre Covid.
