Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you had a lovely Easter and were able to enjoy some family time. It's lovely to see how quickly the children have settled back down to working hard and enjoying seeing their friends again.

The new timetable for this term is in the front of the homework diary. Please remember that children should have clear pencil cases containing writing equipment, including whiteboard pens (which can be bought from the school office) and glue sticks. Any donations of glue sticks or whiteboard pens for general class use would be very welcome. Pencil cases need to stay in school for the duration of the term - we ask the children to take home their 'used' pens/glue sticks so they remember to let you know they need new ones! PE kits should be in school at all times and kept on the children's pegs. Swimming is on Wednesday this term.

Literacy targets for the term have been updated and provide information about your children's next steps in writing; the children have written them into their homework diaries already. We strongly believe in encouraging children to take ownership of their learning, which includes developing both a love of learning for its own sake and a responsible, hard-working attitude. Well done to those children who found time to read regularly and practise their times tables over the Easter holidays. We have given 1 house point out every time someone read three times. It has been lovely to see the children recommend books to each other and we encourage this through our 'Book Talk' discussions.

We enjoy hearing about children's achievements outside school. Please let us know of any extracurricular achievements, for instance passing a music exam, attaining a well-earned badge in Cubs/Brownies or playing particularly well in sport at the weekend. These can be celebrated in our class as part of a lunchtime 'show and tell' activity or celebrated in our weekly Rocket assemblies. This term, Mrs Ellison will be teaching Class 3 Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Mrs May continues to cover PPA time on a Tuesday morning. Tuesday afternoon is covered by Computing and PE staff as before.
